Lenders to Talk to Struggling Homeowners at FREE Foreclosure Prevention Workshop

ARLINGTON, Texas—NeighborWorks America, a national housing nonprofit, will host a free foreclosure prevention workshop on Monday, June 9. The workshop will provide at-risk borrowers an opportunity to speak directly to their lending institutions about homeownership preservation. On-site counselors will inform attendees about available resources and options.

This open forum is a collaboration among the HOPE NOW Alliance, the Texas Foreclosure Prevention Task Force and NeighborWorks America. It is part of a national tour aimed at giving struggling homeowners face time with their lenders and financial counselors to develop a possible loan modification or financial plan to avoid foreclosure.
